Questions for personal Bible study and/or group discussion

1. Have you ever done an apologetics (worldviews) study? If so, what did you learn? Why did you look at other perspectives? What was the end outcome of your study? Why is it important to know and understand different worldviews?
2. Read Exodus 12 and Luke 19:29–40.
 - a. Israel's Perspective: Read Zechariah 9:9– what type of king were they expecting?
 - i. What is the significance of Jesus riding in on a donkey?
 - ii. Any other observations from looking at this from Israel's perspective?
 - b. Perspective from Creation
 - i. Scripture uses creation as imagery to show the power of Christ and all that is under His authority. Read Psalm 114:7, Isaiah 55:12 and Psalm 148
 1. What do we learn from these passages?
 - c. Jesus' perspective
 - i. Read John 1:1–3
 1. There's a difference between knowing that you will eventually die and having a doctor tell you only have a certain amount of time left on earth because of a health diagnosis. As creator of the earth and choosing to come to the earth, Jesus knew this was his last few days. How does his passion and purpose for us spur you on?
 2. Read Psalm 90:12– What does this verse tell us about time and learning from Christ's example how do we implement this into our lives?
 - d. Our perspective from the Scriptures
 - i. Read Romans 1:18–32, Romans 5:6–11
 - ii. What do we learn about God's wrath? What do we learn about God's love?
 - iii. Christ came to bring peace between God, and man. Have you placed your faith and trust in Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior? If you have, is there someone you can share this good news with who doesn't know Christ as their Lord and Savior?
